UN — Portugal Digital Fellowship DIGITAL INNOVATION AND TRANSFORMATION **Guidelines for the** Selection of Fellows













1. Objectives

The purpose of the UN - Portugal Digital Fellowship Programme is to:

- Provide high-level digital policy officials from UN Member States classified under UNCTAD's
 classification of economies as developing economies with access to a capacity-building
 programme tailored to the needs of decision-makers, as well as empower a new generation of
 leaders with the knowledge and skills to address pressing digital-related issues.
- Build capacity in developing countries with the view to assisting in the driving of innovative solutions to foster digital transformation, economic growth and equity.
- Equip participants with further expertise to be an effective digital policy decision-maker at the national and international level via a unique inter-disciplinary curriculum integrating the key domains of digital innovation and transformation.
- Facilitate international cooperation and information sharing on digital-related issues by providing a platform for national high-level officials to network and build relationships with their foreign counterparts, leveraging the expertise of both Portuguese and international experts.
- Support the achievement of the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals.

2. Number of fellowships

Up to a maximum of 30 (thirty) fellowships will be awarded per year.

3. Qualifications required

The desired qualifications of nominees include:

- The UN-Portugal Digital Fellowship is intended for high-level officials, namely heads/deputy
 heads of national agencies overseeing and responsible for digital policy and/or their
 equivalents holding decision-making responsibility in the areas of digital policy, innovation
 and transformation, as well as diplomatic personnel from the Mission to the UN in New York
 in charge of digital affairs, from developing countries.
- Candidates should have demonstrable experience in digital policymaking and governance for their respective national authorities. Candidates should be currently employed in the service of their respective Governments with plans to stay in the related role for the foreseeable future.
- Candidates must have a good working knowledge of English as the Fellowship will be conducted only in this language.
- The nomination of women candidates is highly encouraged with a view to achieving the equal, full, inclusive, and effective gender participation. The United Nations priorities the equal participation of women and men in all its sponsored activities, including this Fellowship.

4. Procedure for submission of nominations

To nominate a candidate to participate in the Fellowship Programme, three documents are required and should be sent by email to digitalfellowship@mne.pt and to egov-digitalfellowship@unu.edu.

- 1. An official communication (i.e. Note Verbale) from the Member State, through the Permanent Mission to the United Nations in New York. The communication should, if applicable, list all nominations from that Member State (if more than one nomination is made, these should be ranked by order of priority).
- **2.** A nomination form (as contained in Annex IV) must be submitted for each individual candidate.
- **3.** A passport copy (biometric data page) must be submitted for each individual candidate, and the passport should be valid for a minimum of 6 months prior to the organization of the Fellowship.

5. Deadline for nominations

All nominations must be received by **February 2nd 2026**. Nominations received after this date will not be considered.

6. Dates and duration of the Fellowship

The third edition of the fellowship will take place from **13 - 17 April 2026**, spanning a total of 5 (five) days (excludes travel time to and from Portugal). Participants are required to attend the whole duration of the Fellowship as the sessions will build on each other.

7. Financial and logistical aspects

Each selected participant will be provided with:

- Round trip economy class flights from the capital of the country of origin to Porto International Airport.
- Transportation from Porto International Airport to Guimarães.
- Hotel accommodation in Guimarães for the duration of the Fellowship.
- Breakfast, lunches, coffee breaks and one Opening Dinner during of the Fellowship.

The organizers will not be providing:

- Internal travels in the country of origin, nor flights initially departing from and/or having as
 final destination any city other than the capital of the country of origin. Furthermore, the
 organizers will not cover hotel accommodations on the trip from the country of origin and
 Portugal.
- Daily subsistence allowances (DSA).

- Travel or personal insurance cover. Participants are encouraged to purchase those by their own means.
- Assistance in obtaining travel visas, including travel/accommodation expenses to another city
 for visa arrangements. Once selected, participants should make their own arrangements to
 obtain the aforementioned visa for their visit to Portugal, as necessary and as soon as possible.
