INTRODUCTION

Academic publishing, also referred to as scholarly communication, is the foundation of academia and research. It encompasses a wide range of activities, including reading, writing, reviewing, and editing. While this process is demanding, a set of auxiliary mechanisms can play a crucial role in supporting researchers at different career stages, particularly junior colleagues.

In this context, the United Nations University – Operating Unit on Policy-Driven Electronic Governance (UNU-EGOV) has decided to organize **Write. Review. Publish. — Webinar Series on Academic Publishing** aimed at sharing experiences and insights from esteemed colleagues and editors working in the fields of information and communication technologies (ICTs), information science (IS), public administration (PA) and other related and complementary fields.

OBJECTIVES

General Objective

The main objective is to support researchers, particularly junior colleagues, in navigating the academic publishing and peer-review processes by providing practical insights, editorial perspectives, and experiential knowledge from experienced scholars and editors.

Specific Objectives

- Share editorial experiences and insights into how academic submissions are evaluated.

- Provide guidance on how to develop academic articles, including the narratives and processes behind successful publications.
- Improve participants' understanding of how to conduct constructive and effective peer reviews.
- Enhance writing competencies through practical advice and real-world examples.
- Foster interaction and dialogue between participants and experienced academics through dedicated Q&A sessions.

ACTIVITIES

The initiative consists of a structured series of **eight webinars** planned throughout 2026 and organized around three main thematic sub-domains:

- Editorial experiences and insights
- Developing academic articles and the stories behind publications
- Conducting peer reviews

Each session will feature an experienced academic or editor, combining presentations with interactive discussion and dedicated time for questions and answers.
